Reminder: At present the page count for books being brailled is 160-175 braille pages. Please try and keep the volumes to this size as they come unbound easily and are hard to handle when they get larger than that. Because of the bulk of a braille volume, division should always favor smaller volumes (this is a quote from the Instruction Manual, section 19.7).

There are 5 sessions starting Thursday afternoon with a total of 25 workshops to choose from.

is easy to work with (perhaps bringing in lots of candy helped) and hope that she will continue to be available in the future. Thank you for all of your work over the years and best wishes for the future.







