

The older I get the faster time seems to fly. It is time for another Fall update from BLTS. Our office always seems to be buzzing with transcribers and other volunteers going about the activities that help us provide the services which are our mission to the blind and visually impaired.

Our Braille Coordinator has been busy this summer with requests from government agencies, businesses, schools and individual people. We are very pleased that our Nemeth transcriber (Melody Moore) has been able to use her skills this summer for Wisconsin school requests. We have also been doing quite a bit of transcribing for a braille lending library which serves the Amish community.

We have also been able to provide tactile material using our new TactileView software and special embosser. This has allowed us to provide quality diagrams, charts, and figures for math as well as other tactiles as needed.


Our class for new transcribers is coming to a close and they will soon be sending their manuscripts for certification from the Library of Congress. We look forward to adding them to our BLTS roster of braille transcribers.

## **BLTS TactileView Embosser**



BLTS is producing Nemeth math for the first time in quite a while and that has highlighted a need for accurate and crisp tactiles that go with math diagrams and charts. Our Irie BrailleSheet embosser was purchased for regular braille embossing, but because it works with the TactileView software it is better suited for that use. TactileView creates pictures for people who cannot see. These

pictures are transformed for them into tactile graphics. Blind people can read them by touch and interpret the tactile material. Thousands of ready-to-use designs can be downloaded from the TactileView catalog, and can also be imported in a wide range of file formats and sources. Melody Moore has been spending a lot of time learning this software and we are now reaping the benefits. We have produced math tactiles for worksheets and tactiles for acupuncture books so far. This is a real boost to our ability to provide tactiles for other uses as well. We are pleased to have this skill added to our collage tactile production already in use. Both meet different needs and provide a valuable service to our braille readers.



## **Treasurer Needed**

Sue Nelson has been Treasurer of BLTS for close to 20 years and is ready to pass the job on to someone else. We need someone who has some experience with accounting and government reporting to fill this position. That means that if a person has worked for or retired from an accounting or tax preparation group, they would be perfect. Also, if they have access to accounting and tax software it would be a bonus.

Aaron handles most of the day-to-day activities such as paying bills and depositing checks. The Treasurer balances the monthly checking account and enters our employee hours to OnPay, a company that does payroll and computes and deposits checks to the employee accounts and sends income tax forms to them at the end of the year. The Treasurer also reports to the Board when there is a Board meeting.
